- Where and when do you feel most confident in yourself?

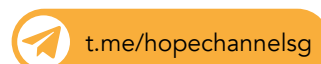


Tip #5 for having great conversations with your child

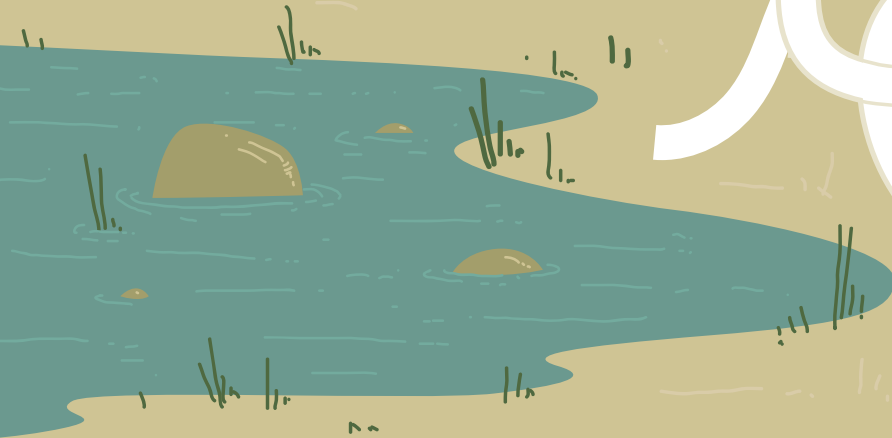
