Main purpose

The PE Teacher will be responsible for delivering high-quality physical education instruction to students, fostering a love for sports, and promoting physical well-being. They will prepare students for their GCSE PE examinations and encourage the development of healthy lifestyles.

Duties and Responsibilities

Instructional Duties:

- Develop and Implement Curriculum: Designing lesson plans that align with the national curriculum and school's standards for physical education.
- Deliver Engaging Lessons: Teaching a varied PE curriculum that engages all students and encourages a healthy lifestyle.
- Assessments: Regularly assessing student performance and providing constructive feedback to help students improve.
- Exam Preparation: Preparing students for GCSE PE examinations and ensuring they understand the assessment criteria.

Student Support and Safety:

- Promote Wellbeing: Encouraging students to develop physical fitness and healthy habits.
- Safeguarding: Ensuring the safety of students during all physical activities and reporting any concerns in line with school policy.

• Inclusivity: Adapting activities to suit the needs of all students, including those with special educational needs or disabilities.

Extracurricular and School Events:
