Review the GC Working Policies and the Church Manual and harmonize with previous actions taken related to adopting the Combined Offering Plan.

Encourage local conferences to invest in the training of elders, church clerks, treasurers, and stewardship directors in the spiritual connection of stewardship.

Request local conferences and other administrative levels to communicate to church members at least annually about finances through accessible and user-friendly platforms about the following:

- 1. Use of tithes and offerings.
- 2. Real-life stories, following an agreed standard format, linking giving with progress in mission.

Ensure that Local Conferences implement an internal control system, that includes an annual local church audit. The audit reports are to be presented to respective church boards, church business meetings, and preferably shared to the church at large whenever possible.

Set up an editorial committee to develop a resource material for financial literacy seminars that local churches can adapt to their context.

Train a pool of financial literacy educators comprising of treasurers, stewardship leaders, pastors, and other resource people to regularly organize Financial Literacy Seminars for the local church and the community as a nurturing and evangelistic tool.

Add a line to the treasurers' report at all levels that indicates the monthly number of giving units. For nurture and retention purposes, local church treasurers should communicate information about individual members participation in tithing to pastors and any other person approved by the church.

Provide an instrument and collect information for local churches, conferences, unions, and divisions to consolidate data for their territory about:

- GC/Divisions/ Unions/ Conferences/ Churches
- 1. The pattern in participation for tithing and regular offerings.
- 2. The Generosity Index regarding total offerings as a percentage of tithe.
